

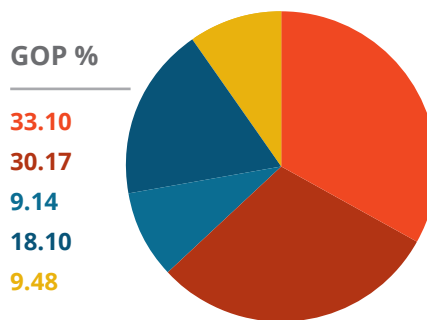
INDIANA SURVEY:

On June 19 and June 20, as well as July 10, Advantage conducted a survey of high propensity Republican voters in Indiana. 580 participants qualified and were randomly sampled via telephone interview for a margin of error of 4%.

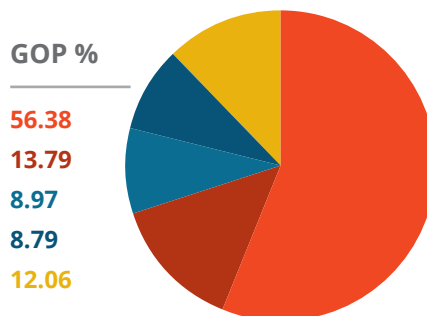

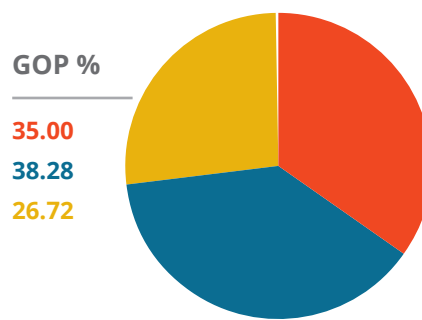

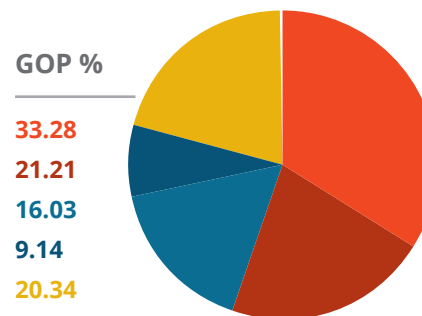

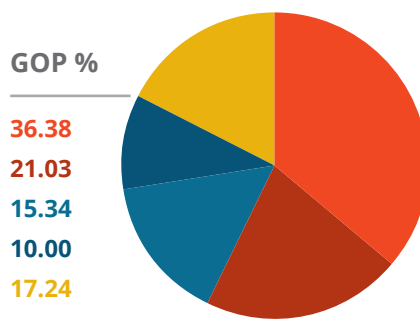

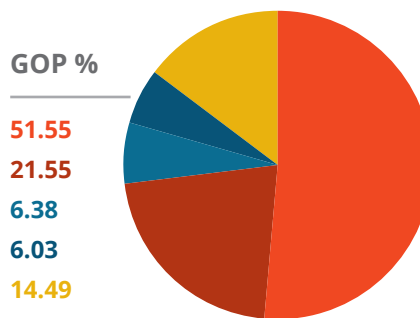

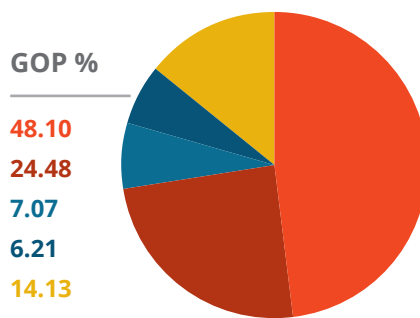

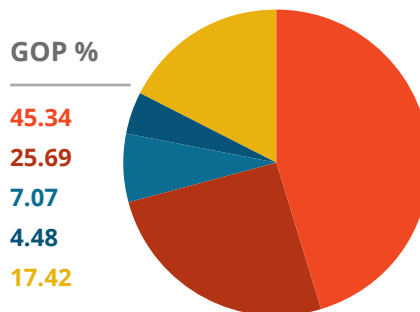

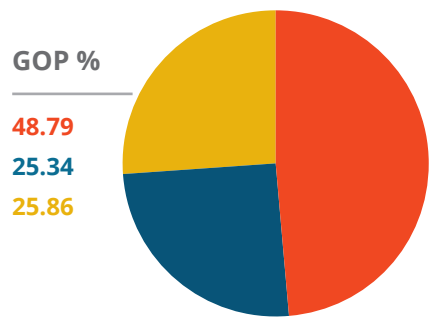

Do you think Republicans serving in the Indiana Legislature should support or oppose Governor Pence's Medicaid expansion plan?

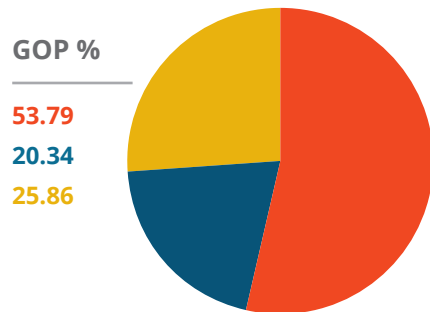

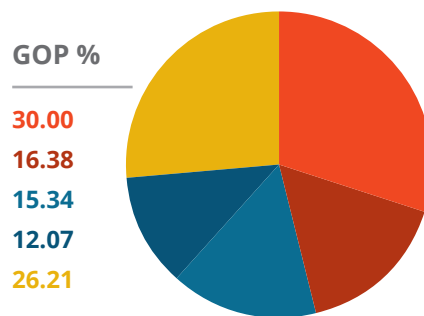
