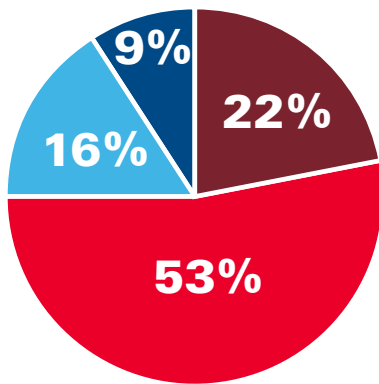

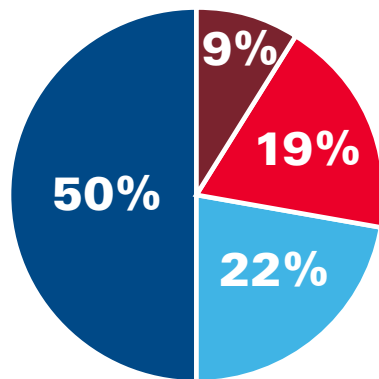
If Arkansas were to repeal its ObamaCare Medicaid expansion



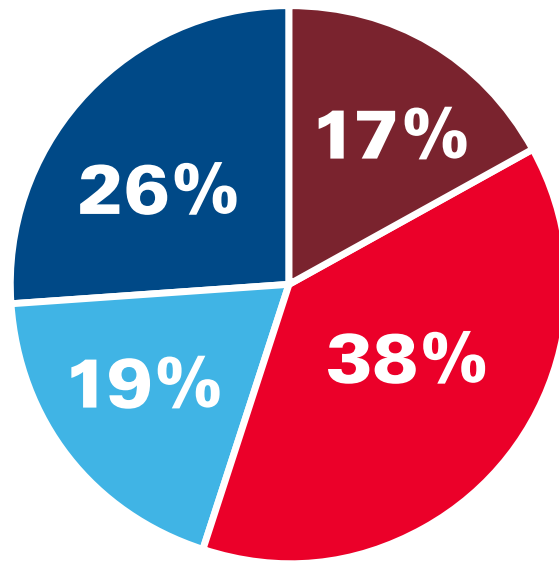
which type of repeal plan would you be most likely to support?

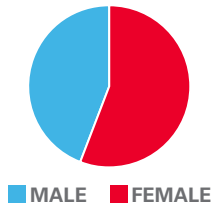
Which candidate for governor did you vote for?

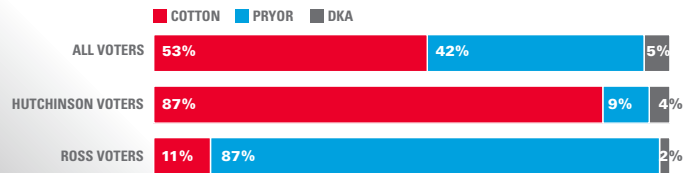

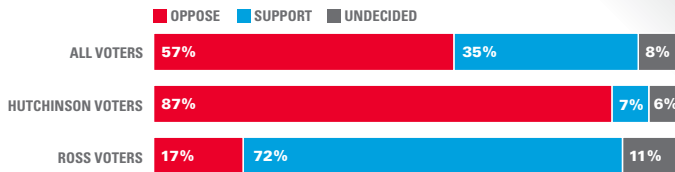

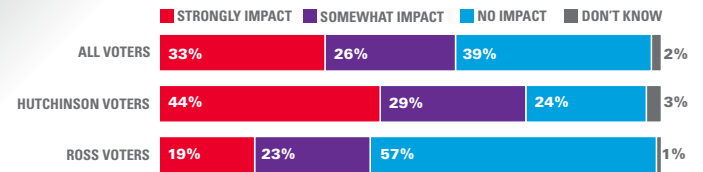
Which candidate for U.S. Senate did you vote for?



In 2010 Congress passed the Affordable Care Act, otherwise known as "ObamaCare." Do you support or oppose ObamaCare?

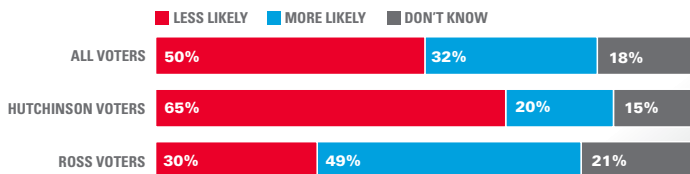


How much did your views on ObamaCare impact who you voted for in the November election?

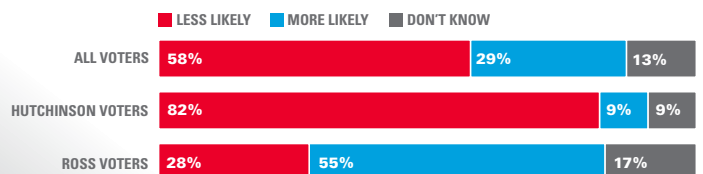


In 2013, Arkansas passed ObamaCare's Medicaid expansion with a program called the Private Option, which uses federal and state tax dollars to pay for private insurance coverage for thousands of low-income, working-age adults for free. Next year, the legislature will decide whether to continue taxpayer-funding of the program.

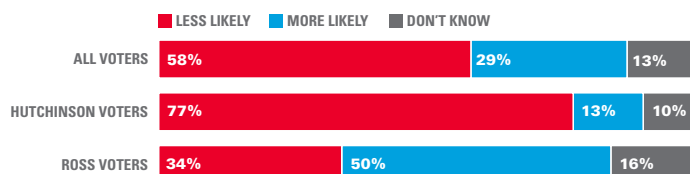
Arkansas's Medicaid expansion is paid for with \$716 billion in cuts to Medicare. It's estimated that close to 42,000 Arkansas seniors will lose their Medicare Advantage plans as a direct result of these cuts. Knowing this, are you more or less likely to support Arkansas's Medicaid expansion?



Arkansas's Medicaid expansion program has been over-budget every single month since it started in January 2014. These overruns could ultimately force Arkansas taxpayers to pay more than \$20 million to the federal government this year, and more in future years. Knowing this, are you more or less likely to support Arkansas's Medicaid expansion?



More than 200,000 able-bodied, childless adults have signed up for Arkansas's Medicaid expansion—a number that may soon exceed the total number of people state officials said would ever be on the program. Meanwhile, Arkansas is struggling to fund Medicaid for the aged, blind, and disabled and thousands of Arkansans are currently on a waiting list to get in.
